GOAL 2008 Update

In 2008 we have been able to deliver an “Enhanced Dialysis Module” and a Bed Scale requested by the new unit in Mali Losinj for local patients who have waited for years for the comfort of treatment so much closer to home. We also ordered an IVRA machine used for local anesthesia for arms and legs; as well as a CTG fetus monitor for use on mothers for the emergency transport and delivery of babies. The “Dom Zdravlje” in Mali Losinj is also in need of vital Emergency unit portable Respirator to transport patient in a coma; a 3 channel EKG machine for Mali Losinj and the Cres Ambulanta. Mali Losinj is also

asking for a “spirometer” to measure lung capacity in the ER unit. Cres also requested an “Electrolyte Analyzer” for the blood, and a digital and “Detecto” scale.

The “Cunski Ambulanta” received a wheelchair; glucose meter; blood pressure gauge; first aid kit in August (see photo.) An oxygen tank they requested will be sent when donations are collected.

To complete our pledge we need to complete our Goal of \$40,000.00 in 2009. Please make a generous donation to our Appeal and/or Fund Raisers.

Cunski Donation Presented on August 22, 2008

Cunski residents were notified about the presentation and on behalf of IMAS Maris spoke about the donations and what IMAS is all about. In addition to our donations, we pledged an oxygen tank as money becomes available. President Calic presented us, IMAS, with a "Thank you" plaque and invited everyone for some refreshments at the local restaurant. A Novi List reporter was also there to take pictures and issued a news article the following days.

How are our donations being used?

"Rendgen aparat koji je doniran Domu zdravlja 2003. godine godišnje je bio korišten na cca 3200 pacijenata što bi za ovaj ukupni period oko 20 000 snimanja. Aparat je korišten i za hitne slučajeve koji su se događali turistima koji ljetuju na našim otocima. Zahvaljujući tom aparatu i doniranom UTZ aparatu dobili smo i specijalizaciju za našeg liječnika koji bi za dvije godine trebao biti specijalist za radiologiju i UTZ. Ultrazvučni aparat koji je počeo s radom 2008 g. mjesečno je obavljao oko stotinu pregleda što bi do sada iznosilo oko 900 pregleda. Nije potrebno posebno isticati dobru kvalitetu pregleda na novom aparatu. Dijalizni modul i vaga su isto tako u funkciji jer sada već imamo 14 pacijenata s našeg područja koji koriste usluge hemodijalize.

Dodatna donacija, naročito uređaj za intravensku anesteziju dodati će novu kvalitetu životu naših otočana jer ćemo moći operacije niskog rizika obavljati ovdje. Transportni respirator i CTG uređaj pomoćio će nam da uspješnije rješavamo hitna stanja u trudnoći i transport pacijenata do bolnice koji ne mogu samostalno disati.

Anchora Benevolent Society 1989-2009 – 100 Years in NY!

In the late 1800's men from the island Cres, left their small towns to seek prosperity in America. With courage and determination they boarded ships bound for America and accepted that the future was unknown. Their sacrifice brought them to the shores of New York City. Mark Giadulic and his friends Peter Larkin, Frank Harabalja, Andrea Nicholich, Andrew Vlakancich , Domenick Kucic and Anton Vlakancich organized a Benevolent Society on November 9, 1896. This group of volunteers was recognized by the State of New York as the Austrian Benevolent Society of Brooklyn #3. The objective of this fraternal

brotherhood was to help its members in cases of sickness and misfortune. For its members, the Society acted as a substitute for family left behind in the old country. The Constitution and By Laws were written in both English and Croatian. On June 18, 1948 the name of the organization was officially changed to The Anchor Benevolent Society, Inc. In 1993 a motion allowing women to join was approved. In 2005 the Society celebrates its 110th Anniversary. Its Mission remains to uphold the old tradition of providing support and assistance to one another.
